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
VENUE

Bethany Park offers comfortable buildings and spacious recreational areas on 60 acres of land which includes established trees, creeks and all the interesting life and natural cycles they bring.

MAIN CONFERENCE HALL	Capable of seating 150 (max)	
	Includes a commercial kitchen and server used as a dining hall and meeting room. Full service available.	
	Sunken lounge with fireplace – ideal for small group work

SMALL MEETING HALL	Capable of seating 50+ with self-catering kitchen, Freeview TV, chairs and tables. Extensive covered verandahs with BBQ's and outdoor seating.

We currently provide 74 beds, including a number of double beds and groups also take the opportunity to put up additional tents as part of the camp experience. Tenting sites are provided, both powered and non-powered.
